Our **Curriculum**

Our curriculum, as with every other aspect of school life in All Saint College, is built around the individual needs of our students. We offer courses of study that are both challenging and stimulating, encouraging our students to reach for excellence.

Your child will have access to a diverse range of subjects throughout their time in the college. Our options are second to none and will open the door to a host of GCSE, BTEC and A-level programmes. We offer courses of study, such as Law and Arabic, which no other school provides.

As a pupil, your child will avail of pioneering educational programmes in literacy and

numeracy. Innovations, such as Accelerated Reader, IZAK9 and Sparx Maths, will make a difference in your child's academic progress.

Through the rigorous collection and use of data, your child's progress will be monitored and tracked. If there are any indications that they are not progressing satisfactorily, intervention strategies will be sensitively implemented to support them in their learning.

Our staff work in partnership with students at GCSE and A-level as mentors, in order to raise them to the next level. Academically, we will ensure your child's continued development.

Pastoral **Care**

All our students are fully supported by our Principal, Senior Management, Year Heads, Form Teachers, Teaching Assistants, and all other staff though every aspect of school life.

All our students are provided with the opportunity to access counselling services and we work hand in hand with community and statutory agencies to ensure a positive school experience for our students and parents.

We firmly believe that the happiness and wellbeing of every child is paramount, and each child is unique. A tailored, personalized approach will ensure your child, as a member of our school family, will receive the support they require.

All Saints College leads the way in adopting innovative, targeted, and proven approaches to pastoral care. For example, we work together with Family Support Hubs within our community; teach both our students and staff restorative justice practices in addressing conflicts; and we utilise the latest software to measure, monitor and improve your child's wellbeing.

Partnership working, between home and school, will ensure the most successful outcome for your child.

Safeguarding and Child Protection

Our aim is to provide an environment where our students feel safe and secure, valued and respected; where they feel confident and know how to approach adults in their life, should they be in difficulty, and feel that they will be listened to effectively.

All our staff are fully trained to identify when a young person may be in need of help. We have clear procedures that we all follow to ensure that any concerns are passed on promptly and are dealt with appropriately.

All students are educated about how they can keep themselves safe. Through our curriculum and assemblies, we promote personal safety enabling our students to know who to turn to when they are concerned about themselves or, indeed, someone else.

We have access to and engage with many outside agencies, both statutory and voluntary, that aid us in ensuring the wellbeing of our students. The Designated Officer for Safeguarding and Child Protection is our Vice-Principal, Mr McCaughan. He has a team of Deputy Officers - Mr Coyle, Ms McCallion, Mr S. Quinn and Mr Banks. They work closely together to ensure that the school procedures and practices are in place across both campuses.

We are committed to tackling bullying in all its forms. Any form of bullying is unacceptable. No pupil should be allowed to hurt another, either physically or otherwise. We recognise that all forms of bullying, especially if left unaddressed, can have a devastating effect on individuals; it can create a barrier to learning and have serious consequences for mental wellbeing. By effectively preventing and confronting bullying our school strives to create a safe and disciplined environment, where students are able to learn and fulfil their potential.

Our **Uniform**

Sports and Coaching

In welcoming the return of individual and team sports, All Saints College is actively engaged in developing the sport stars of the future. Our targeted coaching programmes are focused on our young camogs, hurlers, gaelic and soccer players, basketball players, handball and table tennis players, as well as supporting our active athletics academy.

All Saints College work in partnership with Gaelfast, Michael Davitt's GAC, St Teresa's GAC and O'Donovan Rossa GAC to ensure our students are embedded in their local GAA communities and receive the highest standard of GAA coaching available. These partnerships have shown significant results with two All Saints College students receiving Antrim School's Cup All Star nominations this year.

Our soccer teams have progressed through numerous competitions and the College counts amongst its ranks a significant number of boys and girls competing for NI Premiership club teams, including Cliftonville, Linfield, Glentoran and Crusaders

Students are also encouraged to adopt a healthy lifestyle throughout our curriculum. All Key Stage 3 students develop their physical and mental well-being through participation in the John Muir Award in cooperation with the Belfast Hills Partnership and Belfast City Council.

The PE Department provides academic programmes and careers pathways leading directly to employment in the sports industry. All Saints College offers a wide range of qualifications at GCSE and A-level, catering for numerous future careers through BTEC, OCR and OCN studies.
